

PROGRESS ON THE SOLON PRAIRLE

In 1983 Aaron Basten, Solon, Towa with assistance from Paul Christiansen completed a prairie species list on this area. Much of the credit for this area being in public ownership and being preserved must go to Aaron Basten who worked hard and played an important role in the Solon Gun Club members' decision to give the property to the county.

This prairie has been under a prairie management plan since 1984 by the Johnson County Conservation Board. The Poard has constructed a parking lot and installed an identification sign at the area. The area has received several burns since management was started on this area. Over the past several years native grass seeds were planted on disturbed portions of the prairie and some native forbs have been moved into the area by hand transplanting.
